### **EARLY MORNING TRUCK THEFT, RECOVERY AND ARREST IN ELLETTSVILLE**

ELLETTSVILLE, INDIANA (January 20, 2017): On Tuesday, January 17th at around 6:30 a.m., a patron of the Circle K at 504 W. Temperance Street in Ellettsville went inside the store, leaving the keys inside of their 2011 Chevrolet Pickup. When the owner of the truck walked out of the store, he found that his vehicle was missing. Deputy Marshal Travis Perian and Deputy Chief Tony Bowlen recovered the truck a short time later at the intersection of Walnut Street and Oak Street in Ellettsville where it had been abandoned in the middle of the street. The truck had been damaged on the inside and the outside.

While helping to secure the scene, Deputy Chief Bowlen was dispatched to the parking lot of Long John Silvers to take a person into custody who had called dispatch and stated that he wished to turn himself in on two separate arrest warrants. Deputy Chief Bowlen arrived and took Jacob Good of Bloomington into custody on the two active arrest warrants. After speaking with Jacob Good, and transporting him to the Monroe County Correctional Facility, Deputy Chief Bowlen named Jacob Good as a suspect in the vehicle theft from Circle K. Later that day, Deputy Marshal Eric Chaudion, who was assigned to investigate the vehicle theft, interviewed Jacob Good at the Monroe County Correctional Facility. During this interview, Jacob Good admitted to taking the truck from the Circle K parking lot.

Jacob Good was booked into Monroe County Correctional Facility on two Level 6 Felony arrest warrants for Violation of Probation. One of the warrants was on the original charge of Auto Theft under I.C. 35-43-4-2.5(b)(1) and the other on the original charge of Theft under I.C. 35-43-4-2. Jacob Good was also charged with a new count of Level 6 Felony Auto Theft under I.C. 35-43-4-2.5.
