## **ELLETTSVILLE POLICE RECOVER STOLEN VEHICLE – FEBRUARY 19, 2017**

Early Sunday Morning, February 19, 2017 around 2:00 a.m., Officer Zachary Michael pulled behind a 2000 Dodge Intrepid that was sitting at the traffic light at Kinser Pike and State Road 46. Officer Michael checked the license plate through NCIC/IDACS and found the vehicle had been reported stolen in Martinsville, Indiana on February 18. Officer Michael followed the vehicle toward Ellettsville, while Officers from the Ellettsville Police Department and Monroe County Sheriff Department responded to assist. Once officers were nearby, Officer Michael initiated a high risk traffic stop on the vehicle near the intersection of State Road 46 and Arlington Road. The female driver and male passenger were taken into custody without incident.

The female driver was identified as Mallory Rose Lambert (age 21) of Martinsville, Indiana. The male passenger was identified as Jesse Andrew Eggers (age 25), also of Martinsville, Indiana. Both Lambert and Eggers were arrested on the charge of Auto Theft, a level 6 Felony under I.C. 35-43-4-2.5 and transported to Monroe County Correctional Facility.

## **FORMER ELLETTSVILLE RESERVE OFFICER GRADUATES FROM ILEA – FEBRUARY 16, 2017**

On February 16, 2017, former Reserve Deputy Marshal Andrew Deckard graduated from the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy. Deputy Deckard is now employed by the Owen County Sheriff's Department.

The Reserve Officer program is a vital part of the Ellettsville Police Department. Reserve officers are supplemental to our full-time and part-time officers and help with calls for service. Without their assistance, the full-time and part-time officers would face a much higher workload.

Reserve officers are required to work a minimum of sixteen hours per month, but many work significantly more hours than the minimum. While Deputy Deckard was with the department he averaged over eighty hours per month assisting full-time and part-time officers with calls for service.
