

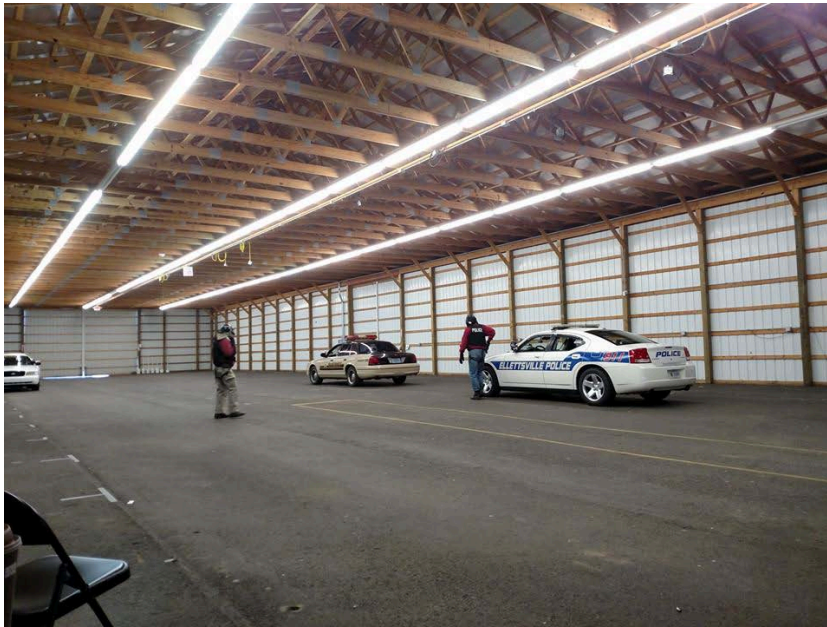

ANNUAL S.T.O.P.S. TRAINING – APRIL 12-15, 2016



Officers from the Ellettsville Police Department, in conjunction with Deputies from the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, spent the second week of April training at the Monroe County Fairgrounds. The training refreshed the officers' knowledge about and skills for conducting traffic stops.

The Ellettsville Police Department is committed to providing only the best services to the community. The department firmly believes that regular training

in varying topics allows officers to improve their skills and abilities and to provide the best services possible.

LITTLE 500 TRAFFIC PATROLS – APRIL 15-17, 2016

The Ellettsville Police Department, using grant money from the Monroe County Traffic Safety Partnership, increased traffic patrols during Indiana University's Little 500 weekend (April 15, 16, and 17, 2016). The patrols were intended to target and intercept impaired drivers as well as other traffic violators.

Between 7:00 PM on Friday, April 15, 2016 and 6:30 AM on Sunday, April 17, 2016, officers had conducted over eighty traffic stops. Those traffic stops resulted in twenty-three citations for offenses ranging from speeding to driving while suspended to illegal consumption of an alcoholic beverage.

During a twelve-hour period between 6:30 PM on Saturday, April 16, 2016 and 6:30 AM on Sunday, April 17, 2016, officers arrested five impaired drivers.

The Ellettsville Police Department prides itself on maintaining safe streets for motorists. Through the continued use of traffic safety grant money and partnering with the citizens of our community, our goal is to reduce the number of preventable accidents by targeting aggressive, impaired, and other dangerous drivers.

ANNUAL FIREARMS QUALIFICATIONS – APRIL 29-30, 2016

On Friday, April 29, 2016 and Saturday, April 30, 2016, officers from the Ellettsville Police Department completed their annual firearms qualifications. For full-time officers, qualifications include their department-issued handgun, shotgun, and patrol rifle. This equates to approximately six hours of training. Part-time and reserve officers receive much of the same training.



State statute requires officers (both paid and reserve) receive two hours of firearms training each year to maintain their law enforcement certification. As you can see, however, officers from the Ellettsville Police Department receive far more than the required two hours.

In addition to the annual qualification, officers are afforded the opportunity to participate in firearms training with officers from the Bloomington Police Department on a monthly basis.

We would like to thank former Owen County Sheriff Harley Melton for the continued use of his wonderful outdoor range and to the Bloomington Police Department for affording our officers the opportunity to participate in training at their facility on a monthly basis.
